

# HOW TO PRAY THE SCRIPTURES

*A simple guide for turning Yah's Word into prayer*

Praying the Scriptures means taking what Yah has already said and bringing it back to Him in prayer—with understanding, agreement, surrender, and faith.

## STEP 1 — DECIDE ON THE TOPIC

Identify what you are bringing before Yah. Be specific. Examples: family, finances, repentance, wisdom, protection, spiritual warfare, obedience, or purpose.

## STEP 2 — GATHER RELATED SCRIPTURES

Search the Bible for passages that directly address your topic. Start with passages you already know, then use a concordance, Bible search, or cross-references to find additional Scriptures.

## STEP 3 — READ THE CONTEXT

Read the surrounding verses and understand what the passage is actually saying. Do not pull a verse from its context simply because it sounds good.

## STEP 4 — IDENTIFY WHAT THE TEXT REVEALS

Ask: What does this Scripture reveal about Yah? What does it reveal about me? Is there a promise, command, warning, principle, example, or truth I need to respond to?

## STEP 5 — TURN THE SCRIPTURE INTO PRAYER

Speak the truth of the passage back to Yah. Thank Him for what it reveals, confess where you have fallen short, ask for what the Scripture teaches you to seek, and surrender your response to Him.

## STEP 6 — AGREE, DECLARE, AND OBEY

Where appropriate, declare your agreement with Yah's Word—but connect your declaration to obedience. Ask: What will I do differently because I have prayed this Scripture?

## STEP 7 — KEEP PRAYING THE WORD

Return to the Scriptures regularly. Meditate on them, pray them aloud, memorize key passages, and allow them to shape your thoughts, decisions, conduct, and faith.

## QUICK EXAMPLE

**Topic:** Wisdom

**Scripture:** James 1:5 — Yah gives wisdom generously to those who ask.

**Prayer:** Yah, Your Word says that if I lack wisdom, I should ask You, and You give generously. I ask You for wisdom concerning this decision. Help me recognize what is from You, and give me the courage to obey what You reveal.

**The goal is not simply to quote Scripture—it is to let Scripture shape how you pray and how you live.**
